Cool Corvette App now available for your Android and Apple devices

The internet has made searching for information a breeze no matter what the answer you seek is. But, instead of navigating a search engine, many apps exist specifically to give you the information you desire.

The "Corvette Facts" app is one of those and aims to your mobile encyclopedia for the <u>history of one of our favorite sports cars</u> of all time. The application can be downloaded for both iOS and Android through the Apple App store or Google Play store and features information ranging from the first 1953 Corvette to the current 2017 C7 Corvette family.

The latest iteration of the app was released a few weeks ago, which added the <u>C7 Corvette Grand Sport</u> and all other facts and information regarding the 2017 model year in general.

Other tools included in the app are decoders for VIN numbers, RPO codes, casting numbers, Diagnostic Trouble Codes (DTC), casting numbers and engine, transmission and rear axle codes.

The designers of the app told us the application is updated at least once a year to include the latest Corvette information, meaning the latest statistics are never too far out of reach.


